#### **Scripture Reflection**

"Listen, my beloved brothers and sisters. Has not God chosen the poor in the world to be rich in faith and to be heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? But you have dishonored the poor" (Jas. 2:5–6a). In the not too distant past a UNICEF study reports that the United States has the second-highest child poverty rate in the industrialized world, with more than one in five children living in households that fall below the poverty line (<a href="http://www.unicef-irc.org/publications/pdf/rc10\_eng.pdf">http://www.unicef-irc.org/publications/pdf/rc10\_eng.pdf</a>). More recently the Child Care Tax Credit that was expanded during the COVID crisis brought the child poverty rate to historic lows. Regrettably, the tax credit is no longer available erasing the gains made over a two year period. For the month of September we will be collecting cereal for our local food pantries. Thank you for your continued generosity!!







