


FALL 'BIBLE STUDY' Continues THIS EVENING

Dear People of the Episcopal Diocese of Bethlehem,

At our joint diocesan convention on Saturday, October 19, 2024, the Diocese of Bethlehem, and the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania voted to reunify and become the Diocese of the Susquehanna, effective January 1, 2026.

Within the Diocese of Bethlehem, 104 individuals voted, while 155 individuals voted in the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania. The voting outcome was 86.54% in favor and 13.46% against in the Diocese of Bethlehem, and 84.5% in favor and 15.5% against in the Diocese of Central Pennsylvania.

We will now enter a Year of Transition. A Leadership Team, selected by the Standing Committees of each diocese will populate Working Groups in several areas to support the two diocesan staffs in effecting the transition to one diocese. Reunification is a move that will bring us "home to each other" as dioceses who separated 120 years ago. It will increase the strength of our leadership bodies, allow for shared ministry and learning in mission, eliminate duplicate administrative processes, and help us to secure a vibrant future for the Episcopal Church in our region.

The year ahead of us will require a tremendous amount of work and it will require graciousness, deep listening, and continued discernment. We will learn from each other about new ways to do things and harvest the best ideas that each diocese has to offer for our common future.

At our Convention Eucharist on Saturday afternoon, I shared from Psalm 98: "May we hear the clapping of the Rivers and the Hills ringing out for joy." It has been the greatest honor of my ministry to serve as the bishop of the Diocese of Bethlehem. I have treasured walking with you along the riverbanks, into the hills and hamlets of this beautiful diocese... bringing the love of Jesus to the most vulnerable. What an immense joy it will also be to venture on the other side of the Susquehanna.

Join me, and your diocesan staff in walking this new path. Together, we will encounter Jesus along the way.

For the month of October we will be collecting Applesauce and or canned fruit for our local food pantries. Your donations are greatly appreciated!!









You're Invited





