#### **Scripture Reflection**

#### **Reflection for February 1 & 2**



Forty days after the birth of Christ we mark the day Mary and Joseph presented him in the temple in accordance with Jewish law. There a prophetess named Anna began to speak of the redemption of Israel when she saw the young child. Simeon also greeted Mary and Joseph. He responded to the presence of the consolation of Israel in this child with the words of the Nunc dimittis. His song described Jesus as a "light for the nations." Because of the link between Jesus as the light for the nations, and because an old reading

for this festival contains a line from the prophet Zephaniah, "I will search Jerusalem with candles," the day is also known as Candlemas, a day when candles are blessed for the coming year. Mary has always known that her firstborn son is special. She has "pondered" words from angels and "treasured" words from shepherds (Luke 2:19). But the words addressed to her by Simeon at the temple will transform a purification and presentation rite into a prophecy: ". . . and a sword will pierce your own soul too" (v. 35). Will she remember those words as she pushes Jesus to act at Cana? Will she remember them at the foot of the cross?

The item of the month of February is peanut butter. Thank you for your continued support of our local food pantries.



# **ATTENTION SUNDAY WORSHIPPERS!**

Our fellow Americans may think that Sunday February 2nd is a celebra-



tion of **Groundhog's Day** and we will be anxiously awaiting whether Puxatony Phil sees his shadow. However, as members of our Altar Guild may tell you, Sunday is the Feast of The Presentation. Historically, this Feast has been



called "Candlemas" and the *Book of Occasional Services* has an entrance rite for Candlemas. Upon arrival in the church, look for this stained glass window (hint: its in the Chapel) then please place your personal items in your preferred spot. Then take your bulletin, pick up a candle, and gather by the entrance. We will have a brief set of prayers, light the candles, and process around the church during the singing of the first hymn. After the collect of the day has concluded you will be invited to extinguish your candle and the service will continue as normal.





Col. Fitzroy Newsum, (USAF, ret.) was a member of the cadre of African American pilots now famously known as the Tuskegee Airmen. In 1989, Col. Newsum received the Brigadier General Noel F. Parish Award for outstanding achievement on behalf of the Tuskegee Airman Inc., and along with other surviving Tuskegee Airman, Newsum was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal by President George W. Bush in Washington DC in 2007. Newsum service with distinction in WWII and Korea, as a pilot and squadron operations officer. After a full career in the Air Force, he devoted his talents and witness to the Dever community and to St.

Thomas Episcopal Church. He was born in New York City in 1918, earned an undergraduate degree from the College of Military Science at the University of Maryland and a Masters in Public Administration from the University of Oklahoma. He died on January 5, 2013. (Source: Episcopal News Service.)


